

Life Saving in the Outback

12 - 19 November 2012

Bedourie is an outback town situated 1,600km West of Brisbane and on the edge of the Simpson Desert. RLSSQ Staff Member Helen Horner, travelled to Bedourie to join another RLSSQ Trainer Alina Graham and thirty-three (33) school children from Bedourie State School, Birdsville State School and other children from outlying stations for their annual Swim and Cultural Camp. The children were taught the Swim & Survive program which included rescues. The participants were then all involved in a swimming carnival, where the children proudly showed off their new skills which they had learnt in the program. A First Aid course was also conducted for the Diamantina Shire Council and outlying stations. Forty-seven (47) adults participated in the First Aid Course which was held at the airport terminal - apparently the temperature was 43 degrees! On the Sunday, the township of Bedourie held its annual Triathlon which had twenty (20) participants ranging in ages from 4 years to 40 years and to my surprise a lady who had only 10 weeks to go before she was to deliver her baby! The temperature reached a sizzling 38 degrees but that didn't stop them from participating.

Get Started

A Queensland Government Funding Initiative

What is Get Started?
Get Started is one of three funding programs that comprise the Queensland Government's 'Get in the Game' initiative to support sport and recreation at the grassroots level. Get Started assists children and young people who can least afford or may otherwise benefit from joining a sport or recreation club. Eligible children and young people can apply for a voucher valued up to \$150 (GST exclusive), which can be redeemed at a registered sport or recreation club.

What funding is available?
A maximum of \$150 (GST exclusive) per voucher is available to help pay the cost of sport or recreation membership and/or participation fees. There is a limit of one voucher per child/young person per year.

Currently patrolling the man-made Boathaven Beach on weekends, the Club is also actively engaged in stinger data collection. Members of the club drag the swimming enclosure daily and head out on a research boat to check for any stinger activity. Jellyfish are a real hazard to swimmers in the area and the more information that can be gathered for the CSIRO and James Cook University will assist the club in providing a safe aquatic environment.

Another important component of our patrol is Crocodile Watch! Working with Queensland Environment and Heritage Officers, club patrol members are always on the lookout! We follow up every report and monitor the crocodiles in the area a few nights a week.
