

utilised in a water free environment. The Award targets Year 4 to Year 6 students and all you need to do to register is visit www.swimandsurvive.com.au and click on school and register your school or centre to use all resources that are available.

The cost of the program is for certificates only (at 55 cents each plus postage (inc GST)).

Teaching resources required include: - curriculum Water Smart Education Toolkit, the Swimming and Life Saving Manual, current Drowning Report and if available a CPR manikin.



For those of you requiring recreational course workbooks we have available - Dry, Wade, Accompanied, Bronze Star, Bronze Medallion, First Aid, CPR and Junior Lifeguard.

Finally and most importantly - For those who are Swim and Survive partners and have not yet renewed their Partnership Agreement for this financial year please contact me as soon as possible. Without this Partnership Agreement you cannot claim your lessons as GST free. Looking forward to a great start to Summer.

Students of St Thomas of Villanova in Mareeba have now learnt skills that could save a life.

As part of the Active After School Program (AASP), eighteen students were awarded Junior Lifeguard and Resuscitation Awareness Certificates. Staff from Cotter's Aquatics ran the Program for 5 weeks from Mareeba Swimming Pool. RLSSQ Trainer and Assessor, June Cotter is passionate about life saving and believes it is vital for children to learn first aid and water safety skills.

Royal Life Saving Society Queensland thanks June and her staff for continuing to educate youth in Far North Queensland. The children from St Thomas of Villanova should also be very proud to have taken part in such a Program which was provided thanks to the Federal Government.



Litesaving in the Skies

On the 9th of July 2013 RLSSQ Trainer and Assessor Shayne Baker put his resuscitation skills to the test in a mid-air incident and saved a life. Below is an overview of his personal account of the event

About five hours into a flight from Brisbane to Kuala Lumpur my brother woke and alerted me to a fellow passenger calling for help with her husband who appeared to be asleep

in his chair. I asked his wife what had happened and how long had he been in this condition and she said not very long. I grabbed his hand and used COWS in order to get a response. There was no response and his eyes were open but not moving and there were no signs of breathing. I asked my brother to assist me to lift him out of the chair and lay him in the aisle, I asked the cabin crew to grab some oxygen and an AED as I commenced compressions on what seemed a very ill person. Due to the extremely cramped conditions I was not able to apply rescue breaths as I couldn't physically get between the seats to the head of casualty. I recruited another passenger in the row behind to administer the oxygen and then instructed my brother in getting the AED prepared for me to attach the pads. After clearing the area the AED didn't recommend a shock and I continued with applying the compressions. With a huge relief and listening to the AED I noticed some signs of life. The casualty moved his hand and I and had him 'squeeze my hand' and gradually he came around and I then asked him his name to which he replied "Heinz". The flight crew supervisor approached me to ask if I felt we needed to make an emergency landing and I declined the offer as I thought that the situation had improved markedly. I stayed with the casualty administrating the oxygen until I thought that he had recovered sufficiently enough. I was thanked by many of the crew and the couple themselves and certainly felt that my life work and investment in life saving had been returned in such an amazing way and to see the colour in the face and the gratitude of this fellow human being was so rewarding. All in all it is another significant piece to my commitment and work and I can't think of a better way to celebrate this man's life and to share my story with my valued colleagues in life saving.
